DR. RICARDO G. ABAD is

Professor of Theater Arts and Sociology, as well as the Artistic Director of Tanghalang Ateneo, at the Loyola Schools, Ateneo de Manila University (ADMU). He is also the Executive Director of RolePlayers, Inc., a training company that uses theater methodology to enhance work performance in corporate and institutional settings.

Prior to this, he also worked for theater companies, notably with Teatro Pilipino at the Cultural Center of the Philippines. In 2008, he was named country representative of the Asia-Pacific Bureau of Theater Schools of the UNESCO and the International Theater Institute; and in 2001 was named a Fellow of the Salzburg Seminar on Shakespeare.

His wide range of experience in training and theatrical arts earned him numerous awards. Among these are the 2013 Asian Public Intellectuals Fellowship Award to study intercultural theater, the Aliw Awards for Best Stage Direction in 2008 and 2012, Lifetime Achievement in the Humanities granted by ADMU in 2009, the Outstanding Scholarly Work Award in the Social Sciences also given by ADMU in 2006, and the Most Outstanding Teacher (College Division) given by the Metrobank Foundation in 2001.

Dr. Abad earned his Bachelors degree in Sociology from the Ateneo de Manila University, where he graduated as cum laude. He finished his doctorate studies in Sociology at Fordham University, New York.
