This transformation emerges from a heroic aspiration to make an impact in the world.

From Passion to Purpose: The Journey to Authentic Leadership

This one-day program is a concise version of the Leadership course in the MBA Program of the Ateneo Graduate School of Business (AGSB). It will be facilitated by the faculty of the Leadership, Ethics, and Human Resources Department of the AGSB. The faculty members are workplace-based academics from a variety of backgrounds, such as industrial psychology, human resources, philosophy, marketing, manufacturing, banking, and media.

The program will be facilitated by learning exercises on the following topics:
